4. Have you developed symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, fatigue or shortness of breath?
5. Have you been recommended to self-isolate or quarantine by the COVID-19 hotline, a registered medical practitioner or a COVID-19 trained health facility?

***If the answers are “NO” to ALL questions, we can accommodate your transactions in the branch.***

***If the answer is “YES” to ANY ONE of these questions, due to potential risk, we ask that you should not come in the branch. Follow the guidance of Public Health on the need for self-isolation, such as staying at home, avoiding close contact with others and washing your hands vigilantly.***
